CIVICS

INSTRUCTOR: Mr. Blake

COURSE DESCRIPTION: Civics is an introductory course that explores how the government and the economy of the United States are operated. It is designed to help students become good and active citizens as adults.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS: The student will be responsible for a variety of activities including: Note-taking, discussion, homework assignments, tests, projects, and current events.

ATTENDENCE: Since academic success is so dependent on student attendance, <u>ten absences per semester result</u> <u>in the student meeting with the Board of Education</u>. After two tardies, a detention will be assigned.

ASSIGNMENTS: Assignments are due at the beginning of class.
